FIREMEN'S DEMONSTRATION.—The Listowel Fire Brigade, accompanied by the town band, and a number of prominent citizens, went to Wingham on Tuesday last, to attend the celebration of the opening of the Water-works in that town. The demonstration was quite an imposing one, there being a very large gathering present, including the Fire Brigades of Seaford, Clinton, Brussels, Wingham and Listowel. A procession was formed, and after making a tour of the principal streets of the town, proceeded to the town hall, where the guests and firemen were treated to a generous repast. After dinner the visitors were conducted to the pumping house, when Mayor Wilson explained the workings and cost of the system. The works are driven by water-power, the motor being a large water-wheel. The cost of the works is about \$8,000. At the firemen's competition, the Clinton Company succeeded in taking first prize and Seaford second. The testing of the works was not altogether satisfactory, owing to the pressure being too strong, which dislocated a couple of the caps, allowing the water to escape. The demonstration was thought to be a close with speeches in the town hall.
