#### **QUALIFIED TEACHERS**

School inspectors of the province are called upon by the department of education to take special pains to see that properly certificated teachers are placed in all schools where possible after the ummer holidays.

"In all cases, before making a recommendation, the inspector shall satisfy himself that the board is offering as high a salery as it may be reason ably expected to pay, and has taken due measures to obtain a teacher with the prescribed grade of certificate."

It a teacher with a first or second class certificate cannot be obtained. the minister will, on the recommendation of the inspector, approve of the appointment of a teacher with a thirdclass certificate, and, failing such third class, of the appointment of a teacher with a district certificate.

If a teacher with a first or secondclass certificate cannot be obtained, the minister will grant a temporary certificate to a person with qualifications satisfactory to the inspector, and at least eighteen years of age, unless the inspector certifies to the minister that no suitable person of the required age can be obtained.

In cases which, in the judgement of the inspector, may at a y time require special consideration, the minister may authorize a board, on the inspector's recommendation, to engage, without advertisement, a teacher with a certificate lower than second-class. In all other cases, when a teacher with the qualifications cannot otherwise be obtained, the board shall advertise the vacancy in news-papers with a provincial circulation.

On the recommendation of the inspector, the minister will extend, if necessary, expired third-class or district certificates; but except for special reasons approved by the ministers, no limited or expired third-class and no expired district certificate will be validated beyond June, 1913, and no temporary certificate will be granted beyond the current term.


