PEERAGE FOR HARCOURT.

London, Jan. 15 - It is reported to-day that the coronation honors will include the offer of a peerage to Sir William Harcourt, formerly Liberal leader in the House of Commons. Sir William is married to Elizabeth, daughter of the late Hon. J. L. Motley, the historian. The statement is revived that the King will offer a dukedom to the Marquis of Salisbury, which the Premier will possibly not accept, as it is understood that he does not desire an alternation in the ancient title which he inherited, and which he values for its historic associations. It is expected that Earl Cadogan, the present Viceroy of Ireland, will be offered a Marquisate, and that a similar advance in the peerage will be offered to Lord Spencer, former Liberal Viceroy of Ireland, and First Lord of the Admiralty in Lord Rosebery's Administration.
