Heat and Cold. An army surgeon who was stationed for some time in the Philippines has contributed to the New York Medical Record some of his conclusions from observation of epidemics of typhoid fever in those islands. One of the most surprising of his statements is that the greatest mortality as a result of the disease occurs during the first quarter of the year because the power of resistance of the natives is at the lowest ebb "at the close of the eold season." If we are surprised at the suggestion that there is a cold season in the Philippines our astonishment is increased by the further remark that "to an American it seems absurd that people should suffer and even perish from cold in a temperature seldom un-der 70 degrees, but such is the case." Cold and heat are relative terms, as the American may learn also in London, where the newspapers are printed with "scare heads" and long articles on the intolerable heat when the thermometer gets up to 80.
