WILLIAM GORDON

WILLIAM ST. BAPTIST

The series of sermons which are being preached on Sunday evenings in the William street Baptist church by the pastor, Rev. J. W. Hoyt, on the theme "Questions the people are asking," attracting large crowds. For the past few Sundays Mr. Hoyt has been discussing such important and vital subjects as What is Sin? Is there a Personal Devil? Is the Bible True, etc., and judging from the interest and size of the congregations which meet night after night, one would conclude that a great many people are interested in these topics and in their discussion. The subject for Sunday night's discourse was "Is there a Judgment?" Mr. Hoyt first attempted to prove and succeeded in doing so, by frequent quotations from both Old and New Testament Scripture, that such a day was to come. The text selected for the discourse was in II. Cor., v. 10. "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, etc.," and the preacher dwelt at some

length upon the solemn thought that all would appear at the judgment, and none would be excused. The judge who would sit upon the throne to try all cases would be an impartial judge, and would also be a just judge. All classes of people would be there—the Christian, the blasphemer, the moralist, and the unbeliever, and all who did not have Christ, the Advocate, the Mediator to plead their case at the judgment seat before God the Judge, would hear the words "Depart from me." The service throughout was very impressive and some rose for prayer. At the morning service Mr. Hoyt spoke on the subject "What the Holy Spirit is given for," and he preached an able and pointed sermon from the text "And ye shall receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you, and ye shall be witnesses, etc." Acts, 1. The music for the day was in keeping with the services, the choir rendering suitable anthems both morning and evening.

Floods in New York State.
Utica, N. Y., Dec. 4.—Heavy rain Saturday followed by equally heavy snow yesterday has swelled the streams in this section out of all proportions and much damage has been done. The Chateaugay River is unusually swollen, all the flats for a great distance through the valley being flooded.
