## Poincare and Senate Stand Firm on Ruhr Occupation Question

Germany Is Waiting For a Miracle, Says Premier.

PARIS, June 29.—Enthusiasm such as is seldom witnessed in the Senate was aroused by Premier Poincare to-day when at the end of a stirring speech asking the Upper House to vote the credits necessary for the "Temporal and Spiritual" powers that although France had been loath to have recourse to force, "now that measures of coercion have been instituted they will be continued until Germany surrenders."

Members of the august assembly arose and cheered loud and long and then voted credits for three hundred and seven million francs without a single dissenting voice.

With much emotion the Premier referred to Germany's financial situation as becoming more grave daily. He said, "she is turning in most frightful, vicious circles without mak-

ing an attempt to emerge. She is banking on a miracle to save her from actual ruin, but miracles are rare.

Not a single day passes but German industries are attempting to meet our own business men or politicians. I am invariably informed of these moves so as we shall fall into no more traps.

At times Germany is hoping for allied interference. When she counts on France's discouragement and lassitude she is making a grave mistake.

We have announced our essential demands and we shall not modify them in the slightest. We don't want to confiscate the Ruhr. We will hold it only so long as Germany does not pay her debt. We have nothing of annexation, we scorn accusations of imperialism."

### Wesley Memorial Will Be Unveiled Tomorrow

To-morrow evening at 6.30 o'clock, at Wesley Church, the Memorial Tablet to the men of the Church who made the Supreme Sacrifice in the great war will be unveiled.

His Excellency the Governor, Sir William Allardice, K.C.M.G., will perform the ceremony and the special preacher for the occasion will be Rev. Frank Langford, B.A., one of the chief secretaries of the Methodist Church.

The service will be in charge of the pastor, Rev. J. G. Joyce, B.A., and other ministers taking part are Rev. W. J. Morris, ex-president of the Conference, Rev. Dr. Fenwick, and Revs. Chas. Lench and W. B. Bugden, former pastors of the church.

Deputations will be present from the G.W.V.A. C.L.B. and M.G.A.A. Others present will include the Prime Minister, the Mayor, representatives from the Legislative Council, the House of Assembly, and other prominent citizens for whom seats have been reserved.

### Col. Nangle Advises All Graves France, Belgium and Britain

DECORATED FOR TO-MORROW.

The G.W.V.A. are in receipt of a cablegram from Lieut. Col. Nangle, C.F. Director Graves and Enquiries, Newfoundland, Continent London, in which it is intimated that all known Graves France, Belgium and Britain have been decorated for to-morrow's anniversary. Wreaths will also be placed on Cenotaph and Memorials at Wandsworth, Brookwood and other cemeteries. Col Nangle extends best wishes for a whole hearted observance of to-morrow by the people of St. John's and other parts of the Dominion.

### French Banker Here

The French bank, Saint Michel arrived from the Banks yesterday reporting the loss of her rudder in last week's breeze.

The vessel reports fish plentiful on the Banks, and hauls for 2000 otts of codfish. Yesterday afternoon a diver made an extensive examination of the vessel's damages, and repairs will be rushed to completion. Hon. Tasker Cook is agent for the vessel.

### Glencoe To Relieve Kyle

The Glencoe and Senef high went into dry dock a couple of days ago for repairs will come off to-day. The Glencoe has undergone her annual overhauling and will be relieving the Kyle on the Gulf service while that ship comes on here for her annual cleaning up.

It is understood that the Kyle will be the next ship taken up, and possibly the Portia may go on for examination before the Prospero and the remaining coastal boats will be docked for more extensive repairs.

## Strikers Raid Offices of Sydney Steel Workers

Regiment Held In Readiness at Ottawa.

HALIFAX, June 29.—A special train bearing two hundred and fifty troops left at one o'clock for Sydney having been ordered out by the militia department in response to a request from Judge Duncan Finlayson of Sydney, for duty in the areas involved in the steel workers' strike at the British Empire Steel Corporation plant.

Bands of masked men visited several parts of the plant last night and Magistrate Hill was struck down by a stone while endeavouring to read the riot act at Whitney Pier.

There has been little violence otherwise, but the arrival of the troops was reported to be eagerly looked for by the citizens, who fear possible destruction of property.

LONDON, Ont., June 29.—A company of the Royal Canadian Regiment late this afternoon was ordered by the Militia Department at Ottawa to hold itself in readiness to proceed to Sydney if so ordered.

SYDNEY, June 29.—At two o'clock this afternoon about 200 steel strikers and sympathizers raided the offices of the coke oven plant here and ejected the staff, including the clerical workers.

Some of those who refused to move were carried out and several were roughly handled.

### Contract Signed For Welsh Coal

LONDON, June 29.—How high American freight rates benefit American freight ship owners was told in an address by Sir David Llewellyn, a Welsh coal mine owner, who returned from the United States on the Aquitania. He declared that he had made contracts to supply 1,000,000 tons of Welsh anthracite annually for five years. This is 25 per cent of the Welsh production, and ensures prosperity for the Welsh fields.

Sir David pointed out that the freight rate from the mines to cities like New York, Boston and Baltimore was over \$4 a ton, while the ocean rate from Bristol, and Channel ports only seven shillings six pence.
