Admiral Bridgeman Commander in Chief of the Hom Fleet, is appointed First Sea Lord, replacing Admiral of the Fleet Wilson Vice Admiral, Prince Louis of Battenburg, becomes Second Sea Lord, re placing Vice-Admiral Egerton, Cap tain Pakenham, Commander of th Collingwood, become Fourth Sea Lord, replacing Rear Ad miral Madden, Rear Admiral Briggs, the present Third Sea Lord, retaining his present position. 
