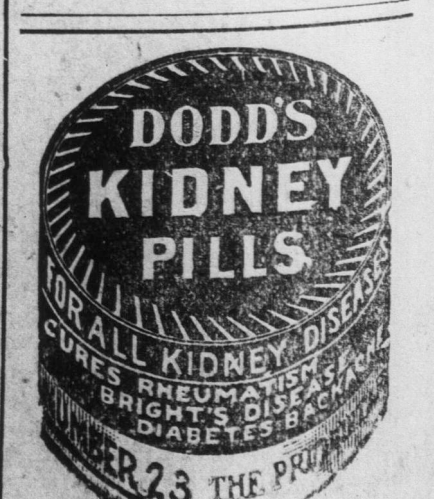
Visit Of Duke Of Connaught.
