



Her Citizens Have a Steady Building Boom On,

And Have Spent Over \$168,778

Brick Cottages the Favorite Style, and the East End and the South Side the Favored Localities-Extensive Alterations and a General Rise in Real Estate Values.

building season, and the steady boom continued through the winter and the passing summer. It is with us yet. It is one of those healthy booms and does not suffer from cold in winter or wind colic in summer, but, like the baby that feeds on a much advertised food, it thrived and grew apace. It was not affected by current hard times, either, and was fanned into a steady glow by the savings of mechanics, clerks and tradesmen. "London, the beaut ful," the name strangers know it by, is fast becoming a city of cottages. From Jan. 1, 1894, to date, according to the permit book in the city engineer's office, 117 dwellings have been erected or are in course of erection at the present time. Of these, 78 are cottages and 39 more pretentious residences. Of the 78 cottages 42 are brick, or brick veneer, and 36 frame. The results of this industry is more especially noticeable in the East End and the south side. In East London that portion lying north of Dundas street and south of the C. P. R. has improved wonderfully. The old Abbott survey on Quebec street is no longer a cow pasture, but a cluster of nearly a dozen beautiful brick residences and cottages. Further up, beyond the track, and nestling on the brow of the hill, is a cluster of houses, and the inhabitants of "The Highlands" only need an electric road in that direction to make it one of the pleasantest locations the city affords. Ontario street has been beautified by the erection of a row of five red brick residences, a brick cottage and a two-story brick house. Then, along Elias street, towards Adelaide, homes of railroadmen have appeared. What was once English survey is being built upon until soon there will not be a vacant lot. The old English plantation on Queen's avenue is now adorned with several handsome residences. South of Dundas street in the same neighborhood, Hewitt street, York street and King streets have progressed favorably. Rectory street sout, where so much depression existed when the manufactories of that neighborhood collapsed some years ago, is fast assuming a thriving appearance, and empty houses no longer totter against each other with every blast of wind. Instead trim, painted, frame cottages and neat brick houses appear, and wall kept lawns and boulevards adorn the fronts. In the suburban portions of South London cottages have appeared in sixes and sevens, while costlier residences are also springing up. Queen's avenue, down townthat means west of Adelaide streethas had its share of the boom. Several handsome residences are in course of erection and others were finished during the year. On Waterloo street opposite the High School and on Wellington street near the park some of the most costly residences that London can boast of are being erected. And soon the new free library and Y. M. C. A. buildings will rear their shapely roofs to the sky at the corner of Queen's avenue and Wellington streets. The brick houses erected in the city since New Year's cost upwards of \$118,550. In ten instances no figures are given with the permit, and as some people vaguely imagine the figures in the permit book in some mysterious manner regulates the assessment, the figures given are not by any means an outside limit. The cost of frame houses during the same period was \$23,475, with the prices of four not given. While many citizens have been engaged in building, many more have been engaged in alterations and repairs to already existing dwellings. The alterations ranged in cost from \$7,350 to \$50 and amounted to \$26,750. Sundry workshops, stables, offices, etc., have also been erected at a cost of several thousands of dollars.
