Toronto Family Have Narrow Escape From Death By Fire.

[Canadian Press.] Toronto, Jan. 27.—Mrs. James Bull and ten-day-old baby just escaped death through the bravery of her husband in carrying her through the smoke and flames when their house on Westwood avenue, Todmorden, caught fire at 1:30 yesterday morning.

The house is a three-roomed tar-papered structure, with two living-rooms downstairs and a bedroom upstairs. Mrs. Bull, who had given birth to a child ten days ago, was asleep in the bedroom, and her husband was in the bathroom, striking a match to light his pipe. The curtain caught fire, unnoticed by him, and leaving the room for a few seconds, on his return he found the place ablaze.

His efforts to extinguish the flames were unsuccessful, so lifting his sleeping wife and child, he rushed to the stairs for the woodwork around him, and shortly after he reached the top, the part of the floor on which the bed stood collapsed.
