CONTRACTS.
For Erecting a Bridge.
TENDERS will be received until the 15th day of June next by the undersigned Commissioners, from persons disposed to Contract for erecting and completing a Bridge proposed to connect the Town of Bathurst with the North side of middle Pass, so called in the County of Gloucester.
The Bridge required, will be half a mile long, including the abutments at both ends, and the finishing of the same; by twenty five feet wide to be built on Hemlock piles, the piles to be driven not less than twelve feet deep through the mud or sediment (unless sooner interrupted by Rock), and to be in rows of five feet deep, the centre and side piles to be thoroughly braced, the centre to be capped by a single piece, which shall project eighteen inches over the side piles, each pile to be tenanted into the caps—each string piece to be sufficiently long to embrace two spans and the scarp. The proposed site of the Bridge, is a small flat, dry at low water, with the exception of a channel about 100 yards wide, over which a gate or draw is to be constructed in the Bridge twenty feet wide to admit the passage of small vessels, the whole to be plank with Hemlock plank four inches thick—a foot path of four feet wide to be raised six inches above the main floor on one side, and a hand rail to extend along the Bridge on both sides. All materials to be provided by the contractor. A more particular specification with the size of the scarping and design of the proposed work, can be seen at all times at the Sheriff's Office Bathurst.
The whole will be required to be finished on or before the first of September 1839, good security will be required from the Contractor for the faithful fulfilment of the Contract—Payments to be made as follows, viz:—25 per cent on executing the Bond and Contract—25 per cent on the first of March 1837—25 per cent on the 1st June following, and the remainder one month, after the completion of the work.
