Mr. J. W. Beckwith went to Bridgewater yesterday to attend a meeting of the Nova Scotia Electric Light Co. The company is making rapid progress in its preliminary work; has already practically completed the purchase of the land lighting plants in Kentville and Wolfville and the negotiations with Windsor are well advanced.
