REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TENDERS AND PUBLIC PROPERTY

To the Warden and Councilors of the Municipality of Annapolis... GENTLEMEN:—Your Committee on Tenders and Public Property beg to submit the following report for the year ending Dec 31st, 1919:

Our County Hospital and Home have been carried on in an efficient manner by their respective superintendents who have maintained for these institutions the high standard to which they had attained in the past and the inmates have continued to receive the best attention possible to them under existing conditions.

The increased cost of supplies have been more than usual this year and though the supplies have been as much as possible purchased at tenders we find the cost of maintaining these institutions, like everything else showing an increase.

Some improvements have been added during the year, namely a new roof for the Hospital and some repairs on the colored quarters consisting of shingling, some new windows the walls and a storm porch all of which have been painted.

There are still some repairs needed inside. The farm has again yielded a good crop as follows:—

Total \$267.79. The farming operations have been carried on this season with the help of the able bodied inmates of the institutions, making a healthful occupation for them some of whom appear to take much interest in the work.

The Blanchard property lately acquired is being improved and is fast becoming a valued addition to the property. A new horse had to be purchased and he has turned out to be a very suitable animal. At present there are 12 cows, 2 heifers and 2 horses on the farm.
