## A HORSE'S HABIT.

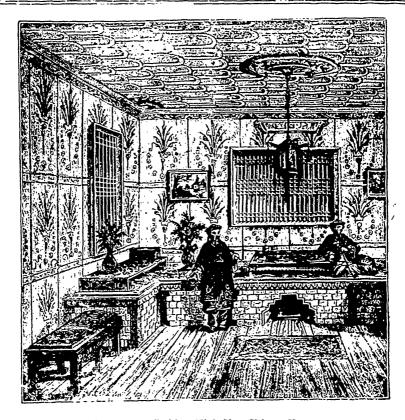
