



MEAT JUICE PRESSES



These Presses are designed to extract the juice from freshly **Broiled Steak**. The yield should be about six ounces from one pound of round steak, costing from six to twelve cents. It has been found that **Beef Tea**, however made, contains no nourishment. The albumen coagulates at so low a temperature, nearly 100° below the boiling point, that it is unsafe to warm the expressed juice above the temperature of the body. Tepid water may be added, but avoid **Hot Water**.

MEAT JUICE is recommended for the aged and infirm, for delicate infants, for summer complaints, in extreme prostration from disease, for typhoid, pneumonia and consumptive patients, persons recovering from excessive use of intoxicants, women in a delicate condition suffering from Nausea, and in all cases where a perfect nourishment is required in a concentrated form.
