for the construction of about 18,000 square feet of concrete sidewalk, 7,000 square feet of curb and gutter, 3,000 square feet of street crossings, and 2,000 square feet of inside retaining walls, in the Village of Ailsa Craig, in the County of Middlesex. Each tender to be accompanied by marked cheque to order of the Corporation of the Village of Ailsa Craig in the sum of \$100 as evidence of good faith.
