REFORT.

Gentlemen, —Your Directors beg to submit the first general statement of the business of the Company up to 31st December, 1887. The total revenue of the Company amounted to \$31,249.67; and after deducting all expenses, including claims for loss and damage by fire, the balance remaining to carry forward to profit and loss was \$22,68.30, in which account vou will find we have written off one half of the total preliminary expenses. The number of policies in force at the close of the year was 287, covering, after deducting re-insurance, the sum of \$1.40,559. When it is taken into consideration that the total fire claims up to the close of the year amounted to only \$649.63 it will, we think, be admitted that the objects aimed at have been attained, namely—satisfactory results rather than a large volume of business. Such results demonstrate the value of the system of inspection and selection, combined with the enforcement of protection, by having proper appliances for extinguishing fires in the hazards assumed. In view of the General Fire Underwriting experience of the past year there are just grounds for congratulation on the results accomplished by this Company as set forth in the statements before you. We beg to submit for your consideration the expediency of d claring a bonus to continuing members payaule on the renewal of policies, out of the surplus, after providing for the necessary re-insurance reserve. The retiring directors this year are: V. Cronyn, James Scott, H. N. Bate, Thos. Walmsley and C. Riordan. All of which is respectfully submitted.


