We congratulate the conductors of the Expository Times on the completion of the sixth volume of that excellent periodical with a thoroughly good number. We know of no serial more thoroughly adapted to be useful to preachers and conductors of Bible Classes. The present number is full of good things. We restrict ourselves to drawing attention to an examination of three "misused texts." Mr. Frederick Wedmore, whose especial acquaintance with etching, both as connoisseur and historian, is well known, has written for Macmillan & Co., a volume which will be practically a survey of the Art of Etching as it has been understood in England by its finer practitioners from Turner and Girton to Seymour Haden, Whistler and Frank Short. While taking no account of that which Mr. Wedmore considers the somewhat mistaken work of many popular people of the last generation which Mr. Hammerton discussed and illustrated, it will bring into the light the achievements of certain great artists of the past who have hitherto been overlooked in this connection (Girton, Crome, Cotman, and Geddes, for example), and will also be largely concerned with the work of the best younger living men It will contain fifty illustrations, many of them made specially by the most advanced processes. The book will, nevertheless, be published at a popular price.
