(A) INTERNATIONAL NEGOTIATIONS AND AGREEMENTS

1. Exchange of notes between Canada and Newfoundland recording an agreement concerning the wives and dependents of Canadian Service personnel resident in Newfoundland, March 1 and 10, 1944.
2. Exchange of notes between Canada and Brazil constituting an agreement for the promotion of cultural relations between the two countries, May 24, 1944.
3. Exchange of notes between Canada and the United States of America recording an agreement concerning the discovery and development of oil fields in Northwestern Canada, June 7, 1944.
4. Convention between Canada and the United States of America for the avoidance of double taxation and of preventing fiscal evasion in the case of estate taxes and succession duties, Ottawa, June 8, 1944.
5. Agreement between Canada and New Zealand on the principles applying to the provision by Canada of Canadian war supplies to New Zealand under the War Appropriation (United Nations Mutual Aid) Acts of Canada 1943 and 1944, Ottawa, June 28, 1944.
6. Exchange of notes between Canada and the United States of America constituting an agreement respecting the payment of expenditures on certain defense installations in Canada and in Labrador, June 23 and 27, 1944.
