PRAYERS

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate had passed the following Bill to which the concurrence of this House is desired:

Bill S-17, An Act to amend the Explosives Act.—*Mr. Macdonald* (Rosedale).

Mr. Chrétien, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, delivered a Message from His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Canada, which was read by Mr. Speaker, as follows:

BORA LASKIN

His Excellency the Administrator transmits to the House of Commons Supplementary Estimates (B) of sums required for the service of Canada for the fiscal year ending on the 31st March, 1975, and, in accordance with the provisions of "The British North America Act, 1867" recommends these Estimates to the House of Commons.

The Supplementary Estimates (B), 1974-75, recorded as Sessional Paper No. 301-1/132B.

On motion of Mr. Sharp, seconded by Mr. Chrétien, it was ordered,—That the Supplementary Estimates (B), 1974-75, Tabled this day, be referred to the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Estimates.

Ordered,—That at 5.00 o'clock p.m. this day, the House revert to "Motions".

Mr. Sharp, seconded by Mr. MacEachen, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-36, An Act to provide for representation in the House of Commons, to establish electoral boundaries commissions and to remove the temporary suspension of the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), seconded by Mr. Sharp—That this House approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government.
