Mr. Speaker: I think before I recognize the parliamentary secretary I should ask the hon. member for Skeena (Mr. Howard) to reconsider his last phrase. Mr. Howard: I did not realize that was an objectionable phrase to attach to a piece of legislation. Perhaps I should speak kindly about the bill and say it is a bill which does not appear to be what it purports to be.

Mr. Bell (Saint John-Albert): This bill, Mr. Speaker, was given frank and full discussion. I have totted up the time and I find we spent 13 hours on it from April 2 to April 6. Many amendments were made, and the official opposition moved two amendments that were accepted by the government. However, during all the time the bill was under discussion the C.C.F.-N.D.P. party were away off base. They had no constructive criticism to make. They did not even understand the legislation. They said that in some instances there was not enough bureaucracy, and at other times they said there was too much. On other occasions they said there were not enough facts, and yet at other times they said too many facts were being requested.

I suggested they were embarrassed by the bill and that they did not take the time even to read or look at it in detail. This is important legislation. There is some urgency for it and I suggest we get on with the business. We certainly are not going to support any hoisting amendment.

Mr. Howard: Would my hon. friend permit a question before he concludes? I wonder what the hon. member would think about the phrase that "if the government wishes to lay a foundation for a fascist or communist successor they would not do better than to end up with the catch-all phrase"the words used by the hon. member for Leeds (Mr. Matheson).
