2d. If one Bishop is constrained to withdrage from the Society, and, not one but, many hesitate join or support it, and your own Clergy, influenced these and other reasons, all reject it; you, as Church men and friends of the Church, must reflect a pause; especially when you have another Societ long established, among you, pursuing the same object and supported by your own Bishop of Clergy, and by nearly all the Bishops and Clergy the Church of England.

APPENDIX B.

The Act of Uniformity provides "that every P son, Vicar and Minister, in his Church upon so Lord's Day," within a prescribed period, "shall ope and publicly before the Congregation there assemb declare his unfeigned assent and consent to the use of all things in the said Book [of Common Pray contained and prescribed, in these words and no oth—"I, A.B., do hereby declare my unfeigned assent a consent to all and everything contained and prescribed in and by the Book entitled the Book of Common Prayer and Administration of the Sacraments and ot Rites and Ceremonies of the Church," &c.
