#### BONELESS FISH.

Fish probably will never be allow ed to grow without bones, and bones possibly add something to the flavor, as they do in meat, but fish bones are exceedingly unpleasant when we unwittingly come in contact with them in our food. From many varieties of fish it would be difficult to remove all of the bones but there are move all of the bones, but there are some which may be made entirely free from them, and if this be done before. move all of the bones, but there are some which may be made entirely free from them, and if this be done before cooking it will add greatly to the enjoyment of this part of our menus. Halibut, cod, haddock, pickerel, bass, flounder and many others may be made boneless, either by first cutting across the fish in thin slices and removing the bones from each portiod, or by cutting off the flesh from one side of the backbone and then from the other, picking out the fine bones and dividing the muscular part into serve.

American Capitalists Buy Seventy Thousand Acres of Virgin Land.

George H. Draper of New York, and Montevideo, Uruguay, is paying a visit J. Mitchell Hoyt, of Chicago, heads of a syndicate of American capitalists, have just acquired 70,000 acres of virgin lands in the Vermilion valley, east of Edmonton, where a colony of experjenced farmers will engage in diversified agriculture.

The land cost \$1,000,000, one-fifth of which was paid in cash, the balance being spread over a period of five years. The tract is bisected by the Saskatchewan river and is near Beaver lake. The district in which it is situated will be tapped by the Canadian Northern Railway Company's main line and several branches, also the Alberta & Great Waterways railroad, which is being built from Edmonton to Fort McMurray by the provincial government of Alberta, and a line to be constructed from Vermilion to Fort McMurray. James A. Powell, of Edmonton, former owner of the tract, announced today that development work will begin at once.
