

BY MR. MacKINNON:

Q. Who would know it? A. The continental headquarters of Technocracy would know.

Q. Surely you have contact with the rest of the organization across Canada or you did have, I should say. A. Yes.

Q. There must be a headquarters in Canada that keeps a record of all the various associations? A. No.

BY MR. MacINNIS:

Q. It was a North American organization? A. The headquarters were in New York with sections and members in all the principal countries in North America. There is only one headquarters. It is a North American organization and not a Canadian, British, United States, or any other country's organization.

BY MR. DUPUIS:

Q. There was a branch in Canada? A. There were several branches in Canada. There was a section in British Columbia and in every western city and town and a few in the east.

Q. You had one in Montreal? A. No.

BY MR. MacKINNON:

Q. So nobody in Canada had a record of them? A. No.

BY MR. BENICE:

Q. You said you were going on to bring that message up to date. A. That is right.

Q. Can you do that? A. Yes. That was in September 1939, before Canada declared war. At that time the political parties in Canada also were opposed to the conscription of man-power in Canada for war overseas. In the election that followed shortly after, I believe in 1940, at least three of the political parties had that as a basis of their platform.
