London, Aug. 2.-Speaking of the poss bility of Government aid to the British West Indies, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, said in the House of Commons to-day that the Government's policy was not settled, pending the result of the reciprocity negotiations between the United States and the West Indies Mr. Chamberlain said that he Messrs.
