GERALD SIFTON AND HERBERT WILL HAVE TO STAND TRIAL

The Medical Testimony Was Somewhat Favorable to the Prisoners, But Other Evidence Was Pretty Strong Against Them—The Case Remanded for a Week.

London, Ont., Aug. 14.—The Sifton preliminary examination resumed at 10:30 this morning, with a large crowd of spectators in attendance.

Dr. Williams testified that in company with Dr. Keefer and Dr. Wright he had performed the post-mortem examination upon the body of Joseph Sifton on July 25.

The wounds found were on the right side of the head, about two inches long, with three stitches in it. Another near the median line was about one inch in length.

The larger wound there was fractures of the skull in three directions—out up, one down and one forward. Two smaller fractures extended from one of these, and inside the skull there were two fractures.

The wounds found were sufficient in the witness' opinion to cause death in the majority of cases. No other cause of death was found.

Other causes of death, but they could not be found owing to decomposition. Back of the ears the scalp was lifted, with great care, but whether due to a blow or natural causes witness could not say.

The scalp was lifted for a diameter of 4 1/2 inches. The injuries were compatible with either the effect of a blow or a fall. There were at least two impacts, perhaps with the same object, but apparently at two different times or places.
