Leffingwell got a scratch on the left arm. One bullet went thru the actress' dress. The man was arrested and arraigned in the Police Court, where he said he was Robert H. Moulton, a Columbia College student, of Court, where he said he was kopert it. Moulton, a Columbia College student, of Springfield, Tenn. He was held in \$5000 ball for further examination. Moulton had morphine in tablets and in solution in his possession when taken to the station house. He asserts that he does not know what he was doing when he fired the shots. This is probably about the proportion of the population vaccinated, so that the disease evidently made no ed, so that the disease evidently made no discrimination between the two classes. It is a poor quality of prevention which does not prevent, of protection which does not protect. The alleged power of mitigation has no more foundation in fact tham the now thoroly discredited claim of prevention, as both are supported by means of fusified statistics, designed to save vaccination from reproach. For instance, in the report referred to, the 67 cases classed as unvaccinated are said to have bad a fatalinvaccinated are said to have had a fatal-ty of 31, or something over 46 per cent. In pre-vaccination times the mortality from smallpox ranged from 10 to 18 per cent. as great as it was a hundred years ago This absurdity refutes itself.
