## PATHEON STORY OF A WINTER

Mrs. Georgina Stanley, Related to Candian, May Die in Denver.

Denver, Colo., March 5.—Mrs. Georgina Stanley, who was yesterday found unconscious in the home of her husband, the dead body of Major Marshall P. Hurd, proves to be a granddaughter of Lord Karslake of Inverness, Scotland. Her mother was Lady Allen, and her father Governor of an English province in India. Lady Allen, by a second marriage, became the mother of Sir James Grant of Toronto, an eminent physician.

Her first husband and their four children died from black diphtheria in Quebec. Several years later she married a resident of Washington, D.C., who was in the government.

A year or so later he killed himself in a hotel at Syracuse, N.Y. She then married Herbert Stanley, a government clerk, and then came to Denver. About a year ago Stanley died from paralysis and left his widow practically penniless and helpless on account of ill-health.

Major Hurd, an inmate of the old soldiers' home at Mont Vista, Colo., came to Denver and undertook to care for Mrs. Stanley. He was a very kind and helpful man, and his small pension was scarcely sufficient, and assistance was rendered by charity. They will ask for an increase in their salaries. They will take the same ground as the inside service, viz., that the advanced prices of living and the rise in the salaries of those employed in industrial, commercial and professional positions, justify an increase in the government rates of pay.

## Tax Rate Ready by April 1

Board of Control Not Wasting Any Time Revising the Estimates.

## TOO MUCH MONEY FOR LABOR

In Connection With the Parks. Think the Controllers—City Hall Notes.

The Board of Control yesterday afternoon resumed their work on slashing the estimates, which they are doing with a free and easy disregard of the recommendations of the committees, knocking a hundred dollars off here and a thousand off there, so that the total may bring a 10 mill tax rate within view.

Mayor Duggan announced that the rate will be struck before April 1. The water works branch estimates of the Works Committee were left pretty much alone, \$3000 being taken off the \$23,000 estimate for maintenance and distribution and other, and \$3000 off a \$3500 request for new cylinders and for a new boiler for the reservoir, an estimate of \$2700 was raised to \$5000, so as to include another expenditure, and one of \$1000 for concreting the sides and bottom of the reservoir, with Ald. Sheppard's consent, will be embodied in a bylaw for \$3500 for that purpose. For new meters, a cut was made from \$10,000 to \$2500.

Ald. Sheppard brought up the matter of the appropriation for scavenging of \$80,000 allowed the day before, and urged that the amount asked for be granted, as it was absolutely necessary for the city.
