Gananoque, Aug. 1.-The launch "I'll See," in command of Capt. Wessel, left Taylor and Green's wharf at 10.30 this morning with twenty-five passengers, mostly women and chidren, all bound for Kingston.

The boat had proceeded but 300 yards from the shore when flames arose from leaking gasonne, lonowed by a terrino explosion, severely burning two male occupants of the engine-room. Ladies fainted, several threw themselves over the side and hung on waiting for help, which was being loudly cared for by onlookers on the lin and coal docks.
