Detailed returns on recruiting in this district throughout September have not reached headquarters here yet, but it is known the total number of men signed up during the past thirty days

was 196. Fifty-six of these were attached to infantry units, fifteen were detailed to Railway Construction and Forestry Corps, while the remaining 125 went to a variety of units such as the Engineers, Army Service Corps and Army Medical Corps.

In London 26 men enlisted for service

With the infantry, eight for service in a Forestry or Railway Construction Unit, and 47 with miscellaneous units. Sixteen recruits went to infantry units after enlisting at Windsor, six went to Railway Construction and Forestry Depots and 46 to miscellaneous corps. Twelve men were obtained in the United

States for service with Canadian Infantry Units, one was obtained for the Forestry Battalion and two for other corps.
