22 TOWNS CAPTURED BY THE CANADIANS IN PRESENT DRIVE

Operation Makes Ypres Success Look Small.

"SIMPLY IRRESISTIBLE"

10,000 Prisoners and 500 Guns Captured by Currie's Men.

OTTAWA, Aug. 16.—The following dispatch was received here by the director of public information from Sir Edward Kemp, minister of overseas

forces:

"The capture of prisoners by the Canadians in recent operations is now reported to be 10,000, with 150 guns and machine guns, which are now estimaed in the thousand.

"The territory retaken in the advance of the Canadian corps, representing an initial frontage of 7,500 yards and penetrating to a depth of 20,000 yards, includes 22 towns, some of which are of considerable size. The proportions of this success will be better understood when it is remembered that in the battle of the Ypres salient last year, commencing on July 21 and continuing over four months, the total advance did not exceed six miles. not exceed six miles.

Glorious Chapter

"The facts connected with the entire operation constituted one of the most glorious pages of the history of the Canadian army overseas. It reflects not only the gallantry and devotion of all ranks, but is a tribute as well to the efficient staff work and organization "The maximum secrecy marked the "The maximum secrecy marked the move of the corps to the attacking front. Many of our batteries were so close to the enemy trenches that not a single shot could be fired before the battle began. Despite this the infantry declare they never followed a more perfect barrage.

"The dash with which every division entered the attack and carried on day

entered the attack and carried on day after day is illustrated in this observa-tion from the Canadian corps com-mander, Lieutenant-General Sir Arthur Currie, who states:

"'Canada has been thrilled many times by the record of the deeds in the field of battle by her sons, but never before have our battles given so much cause for pride as in the fine section of our men. They were simply." fighting of our men. They were simply irresistible. One of the tanks, which accompanied us in the fight and was rechristened the 'A-1 Dominion,' went into action with a piper of an infantry battalion playing for all he was worth." worth.


