REGINA, Nov. 28.—"The Dominion Government, even if it has decided to return to the western provinces their natural resources, attached so many strings that it seems scarcely worth while bothering further with the problem at present," was the statement made today by Hon. W. R. Motherwell, minister of scripulture for Saskatches.
