ELECTRIC SERVICE RATES ADVANCED 34 PER CENT IN WINDSOR

Customers of S., W. and A. Company Power Plant Are Notified.

WINDSOR, July 22,-An advance to the power rates of 34 per cent to the 2,500 users subscribing for service from the Sandwich, Windsor and Ainherst burg Railway Company plant recently acquired by the Ontario Hydro-Electric Commission, coincident with the purchase of the street railway system, was announced today by Oliver M. Perry, general manager of the Windsor hydro-electric system. 
