NEW BRUNSWICK AND ALBERTA TO EXHIBIT AT ONT. WINTER FAIR

Maritime Province To Make Big Showing of Potatoes.

ONLY ONE LUNCHEON

Alberta To Send Provincial Exhibit As Well As Cattle.

GUELPH, Nov. 4.—Secretary Rottle, of the Provincial Winter Fair, who was in the city today in connection with the big show to be held from December 3 to 9, is of the opinion that the 1920 fair will be a record-breaker in all departments. Almost every mail brings inquiries for information and prize lists from prospective exhibitors in various parts of Canada and the United States. Mr. Rottle stated that he received 18 inquiries yesterday from as far west as British Columbia and east as New Brunswick in Canada, while 13 of the letters came from seven different states from Massachusetts to Illinois. The American inquiries were mostly from poultry breeders.

When the fair opens it is expected there will be a large exhibit of New Brunswick potatoes on hand. The Maritime Provinces potato growers believe they have the best spuds in the world. From British Columbia will come entries for the poultry show and it is expected there will be a showing of B.C. seed grains at the fair. Mr. Rottle also stated there will be live stock exhibits from Quebec this year, mostly in the horse classes.

Alberta Exhibit. In addition to the exhibit of Alberta cattle, which is already assured, the Alberta Government have decided to put on an exhibition of their own, showing the wonders of the Western provinces. This exhibit will not be part of the fair, but will likely be housed outside the fair buildings and will consist of samples of grain and oil that is being produced in that province, the results of irrigation and other features.

Although the entries do not close until November 15, enough have already been received to assure a monster show.

City of the Poor Directors. It has been decided to do away with the daily directors' luncheon this year and during the fair there will only be one luncheon which will be provided by the city council. The principal speaker at the occasion will be Premier Drury and Hon. Dr. Tolmie, Dominion minister of agriculture.

MINISTER OF MILITIA RETURNS FROM HOLIDAY TRIP TO EUROPE

Guelph Labor Not Agreed on Slate of Candidates Named.

GUELPH, Nov. 4.—Hon. Hugh Guthrie, minister of militia and Mrs. Guthrie, arrived home from their trip abroad this morning, having landed yesterday at Quebec after a holiday spent in London and Brussels, where the league of nations was in session, Paris, Milan and Venice, which has proved of great benefit to both. The minister will return to Ottawa Sunday evening.

R. A. MASONS CELEBRATE

Royal Arch Masonry tonight celebrated the passing of the 50th milestone of the institution of the chapter in Guelph and the occasion will be one long to be remembered. Grand lodge officers were present to address the convocation, which was followed by a banquet such as the Masonic order is famed for holding, to which 300 invitations were issued, many of them to notabilities who have obtained high eminence in the Masonic craft. Among those who addressed the gathering was Most Ex. W. N. Ponton, grand Z and one of the foremost orators of the Dominion.

That the field of candidates which have been selected by the I.L.P. in Guelph will not receive the individual support of labor on New Year's day is the opinion expressed by several citizens who have been prominent in labor circles in this city for years. It is claimed that among what is known as the moderates the candidates elected

at Tuesday night's convention are far from satisfactory. It is even hinted that other labor candidates may be nominated.

President Thomas McPherson of the trades and labor council, today stated that the T. and L. had nothing whatever to do with Tuesday night's convention, other than the delegates had received an invitation to attend and many of them were present. He did not know whether or not the T. and L. would be asked to endorse the men nominated. Another labor man said that Tuesday night's meeting was simply an I.L.P. convention and only members of that organization had a voice in the meeting. He said there were about 50 present, but only 25 who were members of the I.L.P. were allowed to vote. In his opinion not half of the trades unions in the city were represented.
