LT. C. E. FAIRWEATHER

KILLS OF CRATER "SCRAP"

Returned From Attack Covered With Blood Which Was Mostly Not His Own

(Sussex Record.)

New Brunswick is proud of the work of the 26th Battalion at the front and Sussex people among the rest are justly so of their own townsman, Lt. C. E. Fairweather, whose name has appeared so prominently in recent despatches and letters of late in connection with the crater incident in which he figured so conspicuously. While the news of his gallant exploit was nothing more than his friends anticipated, it was most gratifying to learn of his getting back with such slight injuries. Major W. R. Brown of the 26th in a recent letter to a friend in St. John, said:

"Fairweather, the officer selected to first enter the crater with McAfee, the engineer officer, had a hellish lively time. I don't know how they escaped."

The following extract is from a letter received by Mrs. C. H. Fairweather from "Charlie," giving an account of the "crater" as he calls it on the 18th of October.

Belgium, Oct. 23, 1915.

Dear Mother:—

We came out of the trenches last night and into a warm billet, with a nice open fire and lots of grub. Not that we do not have fire and grub in the trenches, but I must say there is a certain amount of satisfaction in coming out of a very wet trench and sitting down to a good meal without much danger of getting the whole outfit up in the air when a shell hits the kitchen.

I think I told the colonel all about the scrap as soon as it happened. But in case the letter went astray I will give you a rough outline.

While we were out in rear billets, the Germans exploded a mine just outside our trench, and when we went back, "A" company of the 26th, and some bombers were ordered to make a reconnaissance of the crater or formed by the explosion. I was told off with an engineer officer and ten men as the advance party. We were to bomb the Germans out and prepare the way for the succeeding lines.

HINTS FOR THE COOK

Cinnamon Buns

One-half cup butter or any shortening, 1 cup sugar, yolks 2 eggs, 1/2 cup milk, 2 cups flour, 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder (rounding), 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup currants or small seeded raisins, dredged with flour, beaten egg-whites. Mix in above order, bake in shallow pan lined with greased paper, in a moderate oven, dust with powdered sugar and cinnamon, and cut into small squares. Serve while fresh.

Corn Cakes

One half cup sugar, 1-3 cup of butter, 8 eggs; cream all together, add to 1 1/2 cups milk, 8/9 cups corn cake mixture, the prepared kind. Bake in deep cups.

Cream Pie

Four eggs, 1 cup sugar, 1 level cup sifted flour, 8 tablespoons sweet milk, 2 teaspoons cream tartar, 1 teaspoon soda. Beat yolks and whites of eggs separately then together, add the sugar, then the flour, stir soda and cream tartar into milk until it foams and add to mixture. Lastly, stir in small handful of flour. Bake in 2 round layer cake tins. Whipped cream or apple cream for filling.

GARDEN ON HILLSIDE.

Little Stephen Leichman, a twelve-year-old Cincinnati school boy, wanted a garden. And because he wanted this garden very, very much, his little heart was filled with deep sorrow. For he had no spot in which to plant his seeds—he had no ground in which a conventional garden could flourish.

True, Stephen had a home, but the home—in the utterly irresponsible manner of some homes—was set precariously on the side of a hill. The hill was so steep that when it rained large portions of it had a truly awful habit of sliding down mudily onto the Leichman kitchen steps. It is no easy matter to make a garden on a steep hillside, especially if the surface of said hillside has a horrible habit of sliding away.

Stephen has made his garden by terracing the hillside. Because there are evidently a great many rocks in Cincinnati he has built up the side of the terrace with the one he extracted from the hill, thereby making a firm foundation that the rain would not wash away, and also removing all hard substance from the soft, rich dirt that he wanted to plant his crops in. Looking up from below, the hillside is reminiscent of a rocky mountain slope with little or no vegetation on it; but on looking down you see a strip of garden three feet wide crowning each terrace. On each of these terraces he raises a different vegetable: beans, cabbages, beets, lettuce and corn being the most important—Christian Herald
