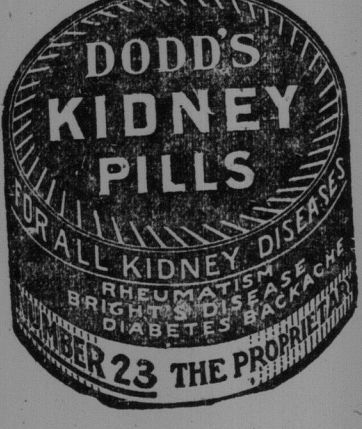

OLD TIME INFLUENZA.

From contemporary records it is learned that in 1862 the people of Edinburgh were visited by a new disease, which was named the "New Acquaintance" as it was supposed to have been introduced from France by those who came in the train of the young Queen Mary, who had been received with enthusiasm some months previously.

The queen and many of her court contracted the epidemic, and many deaths occurred.

In a letter from Randolph, who acted as a sort of spy to the English minister Cecil, the following statement was made:—"It is a pain in their heads that have it and a soreness in their stomachs, with a great cough; it remaineth with some longer, with others shorter time as it findeth apt bodies for the nature of the disease."

Under the date November 1728 Chambers in his "Domestic Annals" notes:—"The influenza in a very virulent form after passing over the continent came to England, and a fortnight later had made its way into Scotland. A cold and cough with fever laid hold of nearly every person, sometimes in a moment as they stood on their feet, and in some instances attended with raving."
