WINES AND LIQUORS

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

A NY Person who is the sole head of a family or any made over 18 years old, may homatead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duige-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely, owned and occur pied by him or by his father, mother, son daughter, brother or sister.
