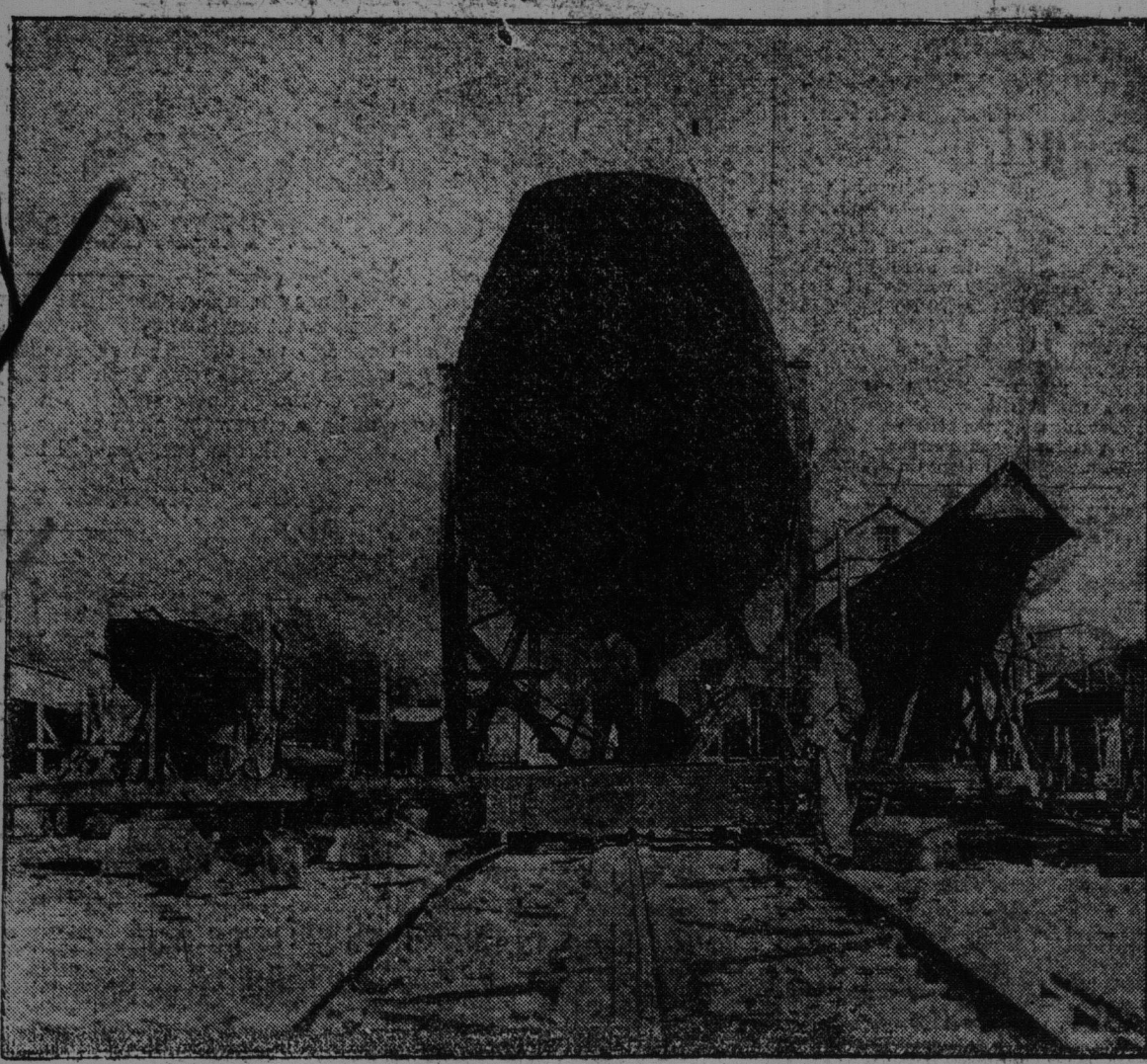


TORONTO YACHTSMEN PREPARE FOR THE SEASON
