DR. FOSTER LEAVES AFTER 34 YEARS
Retires From Fredericton High School—Presentation is Made. (Special to Times-Star) Fredericton, N. B., June 23—Dr. B. C. Foster who retires today as principal of Fredericton High School, was this morning made recipient of a handsome traveling bag and an address, on the part of the school. The presentation was made by Robert J. Love, Dr. Foster completes thirty-four years as principal of the school. He succeeded the late Sir George R. Parkin in 1890, after Dr. H. V. B. Bridges had been acting principal for a time during the absence of Dr. Parkin.

SUICIDES AS HE HANGS OUT WINDOW
Leamon Doane, Near Digby, Gives Mother His Money and Ends Life. (Special to Times-Star) Digby, N. S., June 23—Leamon Doane, aged about 40, committed suicide yesterday at his home in Barton by shooting himself through the head. He was a plumber and had been working in the U. S. and came home last week by steamer. He secured a station but remained on deck continually as he was said to be under the delusion that someone was after him and would get him if he went into his room.

Two Assignments in New Brunswick

MAUGHAN IS AWAY
U. S. Aviator Attempts Flight Across Continent Between Dawn and Dusk. (United Press) Mitchell Field, New York, June 23—Lieutenant Russell Maughan took off at 4 a. m. today in his third attempt to fly from New York to San Francisco between dawn and dusk. The distance from Mitchell Field to Coney Field, San Francisco is 2,670 miles, and to make the flight in 19 hours and 10 minutes of daylight, the aviator must average about 158 miles an hour. The flight is being followed by Indianapolis, Ind., June 23—Lieutenant Maughan passed over Indianapolis at 7:59 Central Standard Time.

RAIN AND HAIL DO IMMENSE DAMAGE
Crops Ruined in Part of France—Lightning Kills Four Persons. Paris, June 23—Crops are suffering considerably as a result of the recent torrential rains, which have swollen the corn flat, and fruit trees have been damaged by hail. The damage at Clermont-Ferrand is estimated at three million francs. At Clermont-Ferrand a woman was killed in her home by lightning.
