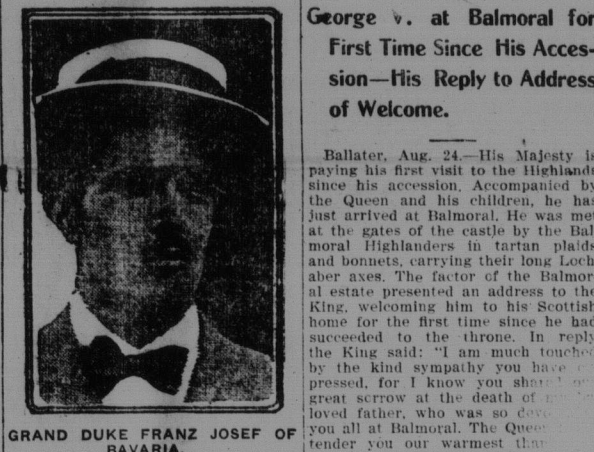

NICE DUKE FOR KING VISITS HIGHLANDS



George V. at Balmoral for First Time Since His Accession—His Reply to Address of Welcome. Ballater, Aug. 24.—His Majesty is paying his first visit to the Highlands since his accession. Accompanied by the Queen and his children, he has just arrived at Balmoral. He was met at the gates of the castle by the Balmoral Highlanders in tartan plaids and bonnets, carrying their long Lochaber axes. The factor of the Balmoral estate presented an address to the King, welcoming him to his Scottish home for the first time since he had succeeded to the throne. In reply the King said: "I am much touched by the kind sympathy you have expressed, for I know you share the great sorrow at the death of my beloved father, who was so dear to me all at Balmoral. The Queen and I tender you our warmest thanks for the hearty welcome which you have given us here today, on our first visit to our Highland home since my accession. Most of you have known me since I was a child, and I assure you that I will take the greatest possible interest in your happiness and welfare and I want you to look upon me as your best friend. After this, the party proceeded along the avenue to the castle, the Highlanders walking on each side of the carriages, and the pipers marching in front, playing Highland Lullaby. Although the duke is only twenty-one, he has been the very droll of a fellow already. There was that little gambling episode in an aristocratic club in Munich. It was said checks for \$500,000 were forged in his name. "As for that," said the duke, "puff! it is nothing. It is what you call a whit—my cousin."
