Head of Canrdian Pacific Sails Achievement of a Cure for Infantile Paralysis Expected— Preventative Method Already Discovered.

New York, N. Y., Mar. 3.—Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, president of the Canadian Pacific Railway, was a passenger today on the steamship Celtic for Liverpool. He stated that the Canadian Pacific contemplated spending about \$34,000,000 in the coming year on improvements and extensions to their line and while in England he expected to place orders for the building of two new ships for the Pacific trade. These steamships will be about 15,000 tons each.

Sir Thomas would not give his views on the matter of reciprocity, but said that he thought the general feeling in Canada was not very favorable to it.
