DECIDE CAUSE OF DISASTER

Explosion of Dirigible Zepelin Z II, due to Partial Vacuum Behind Wind Shield.

Berlin, Oct. 29.—The explosion of the dirigible Zepelin L-11 which on October 17 cost the lives of 28 officers and men of the German navy and army, comprising the entire crew, is attributed in the official report on the disaster to a partial vacuum formed in the centre gondola behind a new kind of windshield. This was used for the first time on the ill-fated airship for the better protection of the crew and it sucked the gas escaping from beneath the aluminum structure of the dirigible into the gondola where it was exploded by a spark from the motor.

The possibility of such suction had been overlooked by the Zepelin constructors and the naval aeronautic experts and it has now been decided that the shield is not to be used in the future.
