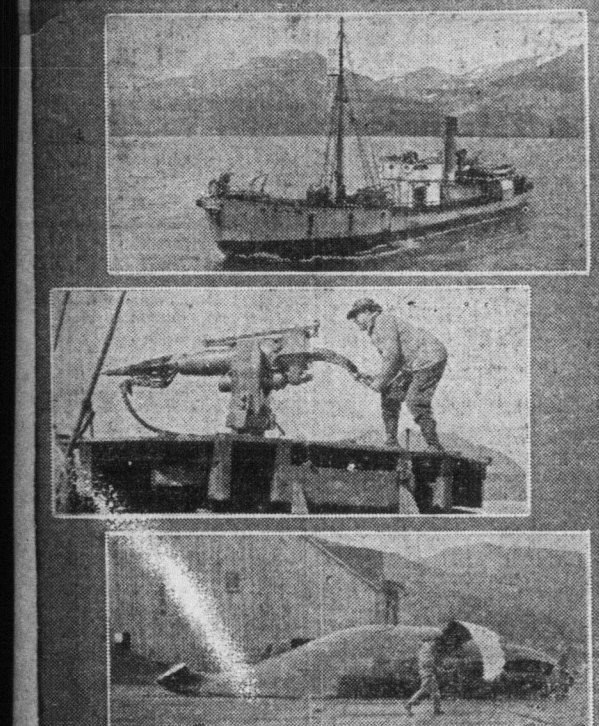

Boys Urged to Work for a Y.M.C.A. The father and son banquet held last evening at Zion Bible School under the auspices of the Tuxis Club of Kitchener was the most successful and most unique event ever held so far.

The boys were out in force, an increasing number of fathers are interesting themselves in these annual events. The supper was divorced itself from the usual "war time" qualification. No one but was fully satisfied with a menu of ham, scalloped potatoes, pickles, variegated salads, coffee and oh! Such pie. The speakers were wound up for the occasion. The boys excelled themselves in their oratorical efforts. He pointed out that the Y.M.C.A. has three great objectives in its Khaki University down to an ordinary institutional effect as carried on in this town at the present time.

These are (1) To supply an ideal and a thirst in the youth to attain such an ideal.

(2) To supply means that a boy or man's leisure time may be decently occupied.

(3) To provide a training that would allow everyone who equip himself to gain a livelihood easily. He vividly portrayed the soldier's life and his religious views and contended that where the Bible is properly taught these men will congregate. Prayer, he said, is the great essential to successful work among men and boys and where prayer is diligently followed there will be no doubt but that all boys and their fathers will within twenty years be found at such gatherings year after year.

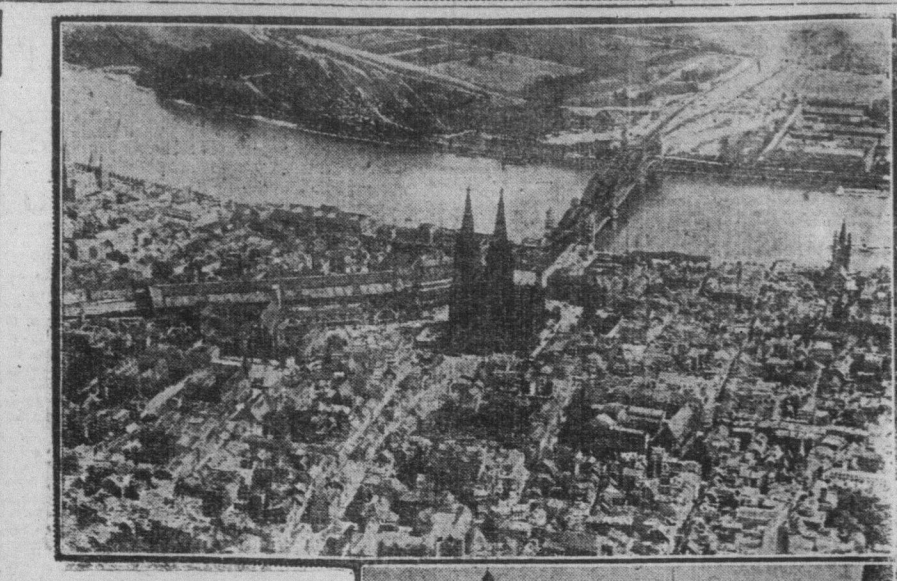

Women in Sweden have been permitted to take the higher university degrees since 1882.

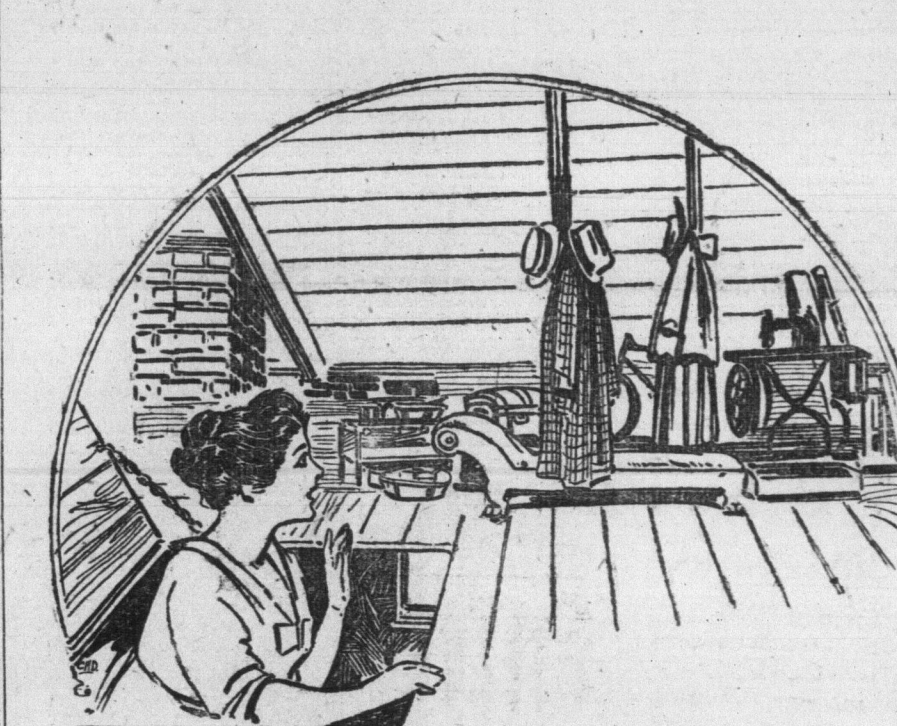
Virginia and Georgia are among the few States in which the State universities remain closed to women.
