



The taking over of the Juvenile Court end and the opening of the Children's Shelter at Hespeler, under the careful Management of Mr. Arthur Pullam and his wife and staff, have made a marvellous change in the carrying on of this very important work.

The 'Coombe Shelter' at Hespeler, is one that Waterloo County may well be proud of, and is at once a credit to the council whose liberality made it possible, and to the Trustees who have its more immediate management in hand.


The Election of Officers for the ensuing year took place with the following result. President—Mr. D. N. Pannabaker, Hespeler.


