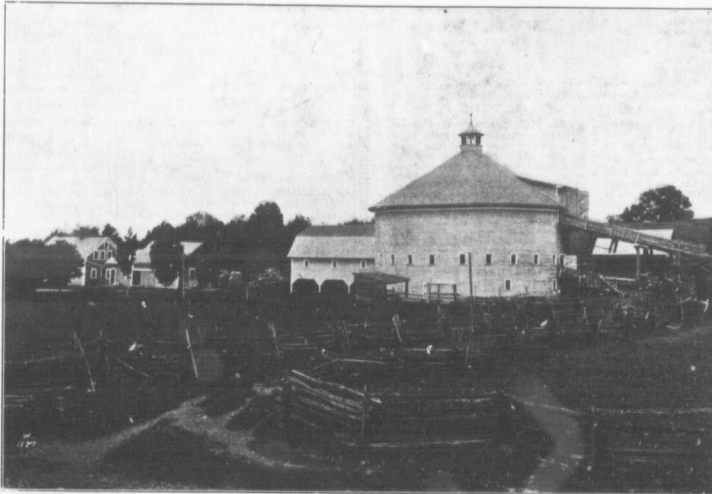

THIS STYLE OF BARN WILL BE MORE COMMON WHEN WE COME TO APPRECIATE ITS ADVANTAGES. The circular barn includes more floor space within a given length of walls than does a barn of any other shape. Hence it represents a saving in building material. When properly constructed it is the strongest and most durable of structures.
