SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-
WEST LAND REGULATIONS.
THIS new head of a family, or any male
over 18 years old, may homestead a
quarter-section of available Dominion land
in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Ap-
plication must be made to the Dominion
Minister Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for
the District. Entry by proxy may be made
at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not
Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.
Duties—Six months residence upon and
cultivation of the land in each of three
years. A homesteader may live within nine
miles of his homestead on a farm of at
least 50 acres, on certain conditions. A
habitable house is required in the vicinity.
In certain districts a homesteader, in
good standing may pre-empt a quarter-
section alongside his homestead. Price \$2.00
per acre.
Duties—Six months residence in each of
three years after earning homestead pat-
ent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-
emption patent may be obtained as soon
as homestead patent, on certain conditions.
A settler who has exhausted his homestead
right may take a purchased homestead
in certain districts. Price \$100 per
acre. Duties—Must reside six months in
each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and
erect a house worth \$200.
The area of cultivation is subject to re-
gulation. Live homestead may be substituted for
cultivation in case of rough scrubby or any
other land. Live homestead may be substituted for
cultivation under certain conditions.

BRITISH MAKE STILL ANOTHER ADVANCE

The Battle of Somme Now at Point of Great Violence

BATTLE OF THE SOMME HAS REACHED PITCH OF HIGH INTENSITY

The Germans are Not Yielding Their Positions Without Desperate Resistance

London, England, September 5.—The battle of the Somme has now reached the high pitch of violence. Against the concentration of picked German troops the French and British are striking blow after blow in what appears to be a supreme effort to force a way through the German line.
London to-day announces further substantial gains at two points north of the sector of 12 1/2 miles over which the French advanced yesterday.
The Germans are not yielding their carefully organized positions without desperate resistance and the fighting among ruins of villages and over desolated farm lands is unceasingly severe, with heavy losses on both sides. Last night the Germans launched a number of vigorous counter-attacks, but the French war office reports they were beaten off with heavy losses to the attackers. The battle is being carried on under the most unfavorable weather conditions. The British made last night's charges in a deluge of rain.
Since the beginning of the Somme offensive, 29 villages have been captured by the allies, each of them powerfully organized. In the east, to regain Barleux, one of the strongest of these positions, the Germans yesterday made six counter-attacks. In eastern Roumania the first clash has occurred between the Bulgarians who have invaded Dobruja and the Russians who went in from Bessarabia to assist the Roumanians. Petrograd announces a Bulgarian cavalry outpost was snared by Russian cavalry. An official Bulgarian account of the invasion says that on the first day the Roumanians were driven back, leaving hundreds of dead on the field, and that two villages near the frontier were occupied.
The heaviest fighting on the eastern front is now under way in the region of Vladimir-Volynski, south-west of the important railroad center of Kovel. The Russian war office announces that in this sector more than 4,500 prisoners were taken from Thursday to Saturday. This number evidently is included in the total of 19,400 men taken on the whole front between Thursday and Sunday, as reported yesterday by the Russian war office.
In the Carpathian Russian troops are still pressing forward toward the Hunarian frontier. Petrograd reports the capture of several more mountain heights. In the Caucasus, the Russian communication says, fierce fighting is in progress. In the region west of Ognott the Turks were compelled to retreat hastily.

BIGGEST ZEPPEL RAID YET

Took Place in England Saturday Night. Loss of Life Was Slight—One Airship Was Destroyed.

London, Sept. 4.—Thirteen Zeppelin airships took part in a raid over the eastern counties Saturday night, and, an official statement says, casualties so far reported are one man and one woman killed, and eleven men and women and two children injured. It was the most formidable air attack ever made on Britain. Of three of the Zeppelins were able to approach the outskirts of London. One of these was shot down at Cuffley, near Enfield, and the other two were driven off by aircraft guns and aeroplanes.
A correspondent of the Associated Press, who was in the eastern counties in the early morning, watched the bombardment of the Zeppelins which were seen in the sky. The Zeppelin was sailing with straggling bursts all around and searchlights centred on it. Suddenly the Zeppelin disappeared in a cloud of smoke emitted by itself.
The sky was clear at the time, but the searchlights lost trace of their quarry. A minute afterwards a light appeared in the sky like a bright comet, which increased in intensity as it descended. Then the light spread out into flames, falling gradually until an altitude of about 1,000 feet was reached, when it burst into an enormous sheet of flames lighting up the surrounding country for miles.
Witnessed by Thousands.
Apparently the gasoline had caught fire and the airship dashed rapidly to the earth. From villages and towns went up loud cheers, but it was difficult to tell exactly where the airship had fallen. The people congratulated themselves on the anti-aircraft guns. For some time searchlights were thrown skyward, searching for the Zeppelin.

THE CRISIS

Over the Sale of Islands Seems to Have Passed.

London, Sept. 5.—A Copenhagen despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company, says that the Danish political crisis, arising out of the proposed sale of the Danish West Indies, shows signs of collapsing suddenly. Although a general election seemed inevitable yesterday, the Danish government has now decided to look as if the sale of the islands might still be accomplished without an election. The leader of the Conservative party to-day (Monday) proposes to the premier that the negotiations for the formation of a coalition cabinet be re-opened, and the premier consented. The fact appears to be that all the parties are beginning to feel that an election would be a calamity at the present time, and should be avoided if possible.

TROUBLE BREWING

Between China and Japan—Troops Clash Again.

Washington, Sept. 5.—Close watch is being maintained by diplomatic officials here over the newly threatened crisis between Japan and China, growing out of the recent clash of the two nations' troops at Chien-Chaiun. Considerable fear is felt that the rights of the United States in China may be affected in view of confidential reports that Japan has made other demands than those published yesterday in dispatches from Peking, and that the secret negotiations threaten Chinese rule throughout inner Mongolia.
Another Clash
Tokio, Sept. 5.—Another clash between Chinese and Japanese troops is officially reported from Chaoyangpo, Mongolia, and has led to the dispatch of heavy Japanese reinforcements. It is claimed that the Chinese attacked the Japanese while the Japanese were advancing to mediate between Chinese and Mongolians.

ANOTHER FRENCH SUCCESS

ON THE SOMME FRONT

Captured First Line of Trenches Seizing a Footing in Two Villages—German Defences Overcome

London, Sept. 5.—The French yesterday inflicted another crushing defeat upon the Germans north and south of the Somme. In an all-day battle they pushed their lines a considerable distance forward on a 15-mile front, from the outskirts of Combles, north of the river, to the village of Chilly, south of it.
Early in the day General Foch began to follow up his success of Sunday, won between Combles and the river. He extended his line of attack to the area south of the Somme, along the southern edge of the Franco-British salient. He was everywhere successful. Since the resumption of the "big push" Sunday the French have taken 5,200 prisoners. Of these 2,700 were taken in yesterday's fighting south of the river.
Crushed Southern Arm.
Thus, they crushed in the white southern arm of the salient, which German commanders in interviews with correspondents have described as the "ugliest position an army could be placed in," and in which the French were exposed to the German concentrated fire from three sides.
But this is not all that Gen. Foch did yesterday. In addition to driving the Germans back on this 12 1/2-mile front south of the river, he added to the gains he made Sunday between the Somme and Combles. Attacking from the village of "Le Forest, which fell to them Sunday, the French swept forward to the east, taking the Hospital farm and the ridge west of Marrieres Wood. The Germans, determined to hold Combles at all costs, debouched in strong forces from that town in attempt to wrest from the French their new positions to the south. The result was a sharp and bitter battle, but they were forced to give up their efforts, according to the night communiqué, after suffering heavy losses from the French machine-gun and barrier fire.
Ripping the German front below the river wide open, the French captured the first-line trenches on the Barleux-Denicourt road, gaining a firm foothold in the outskirts of the village of Berny and on the northern edges of Denicourt, and captured all of Soyecourt village. Further south they took the entire German first-line positions of the old German front between Vermandouillers and Chilly, taking the whole of the latter village. By the British in Battle Last Night on the Somme.

London, Sept. 5.—The British troops in battles last night in France, increased the gains in the neighborhood of Guillemont, says the British official statement issued this afternoon. The British forces pushed forward to 1500 yards east of Guillemont village and secured a hold on Leuze wood.

Roumanian Advance

in the First Five Days Was Considerable

Paris, Sept. 5.—The advance of the Roumanian troops in the first five days of their campaign was considerable, and at some points was as much as eighty kilometres (about 48 miles), says a despatch from Uziesti, under date of Saturday, to the Petit Parisien. The forward march, however, now has been somewhat slackened because of the difficulty of sending revictualing convoys. Although the ground on the eastern Hungarian frontier was unfavorable for the Roumanians, the correspondent said, they were successful in their dash across the river and now occupy the valleys.
Roumania's declaration of war, the despatch adds, was so unexpected by Austria, that only a few troops of the Dual Monarchy were on the Roumanian frontier and these were not on guard when hostilities were begun. Half an hour before war was declared, Hungarian officers were drinking with Roumanians at a frontier railroad station. Soon afterwards the station, took the officers as prisoners and then captured quantities of materials. The Roumanian offensive was so sudden that the Austrians had not time to blow up bridges nor tunnels.

A STRIKE SEEMS TO BE VERY IMMINENT

Over the Elevated and Subway Lines in New York City.

New York, Sept. 5.—A strike seems imminent to-day on the elevated and subway lines operated by the Interborough Rapid Transit Company in Manhattan and the Bronx. Officials of the company and representatives of the Amalgamated Association of Street and Electric Railway employees met this morning to consider the demands of the union that the company annual contracts signed by the employees several days ago when a strike was first threatened. But President Shonts' announcement late last night that the company would not grant the union's demands, indicated that to-day's meeting would fall to bring peace.
Labor leaders asserted to-day that they would stick to their demands, and predicted that a strike would be called within twenty-four hours if the company refused to make concessions.
The contract which the employees' union wishes to have annulled binds the employees not to ask for advances in pay and improvement in working conditions other than those already granted to them.

On board S. S. Scandinavian, 12-8-'16.
We have at last got through with riding the cars for the present, having arrived here on Sunday, the 6th, after travelling for about 4 days and 3 nights. We are pretty good on board ship on Sunday and set sail on the following Wednesday.
