Lieut.-Governor.—His Honour* ABNER REID McCLELAN. Descended from an Irish family which came from Londonderry, Irel., to N.S. in the latter part of the last century. Youngest s. of the late Peter McClelan, Esq., J.P. B. at Hopewell, N.B., 4 Jan., 1831. Ed. there and at Mount Allison Academy. M., Anna B., dau. of the late W. J. Reid, Esq., Collector of Customs, Port of Harvey. Is a retired merchant. Was one of the Governors of Mount Allison Wesleyan Coll., Sackville, N.B., and Vice-Presdt. of the Alumni Soc. of the Academy and Coll. of that name. Has been for a number of years Commr. of the Civil Court and Auditor of the Municipality of Albert. Was a mem. of the Government of N.B. as Chief Commr. of Public Works, from April, 1866, until the Union. Sat for Albert in N.B. Assem. from 1854 until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867, and sat in that House until Jan., 1897, when apptd. Lieutenant-Governor. (Salary, \$9,000.) — *Fredericton, N.B.*
