WHITE, Hon. ALONZO J., Q.C. (Cape Breton.)

Called to the Bar N. S., May 1858. Apptd. a Q.C., May 1876. Apptd. a mem. of the Ex. Council and Commr. of Crown Lands, 20 Feb., 1874; Apptd. Attorney-Genl. 3 Aug., 1882. First returned to Parlt., at g.e. 1867; re-elected at g.e. 1871; by acclamation on his appt. to office; re-elected at g.e. 1874; defeated at g.e. 1879 but re-elected at last g.e.
