

SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

The Lewis Bradley Pioneer Museum is recommended for designation on the architectural grounds that it is a well-preserved-example of a salt-box style farmhouse This simple gable structure with its roof-line extension represents the settler's second home. The historical grounds for designation are that it was built by Lewis Bradley, a United Empire Loyalist. He received the title to the Crown Grant in 1811, but did not build this house until c. 1830. He is representative of many early settlers in the Clarkson area.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of June 22,
