Inchurn you thanks for your congratulation on our having settled our land Offairs, notwithstanding the Government here have yet retarded the accomplishing the business, and Seem to wish loful new obstacles in the way as they have usually done, your apprehensions of our going too far by asking to have the remainder so granted as to enable ses to dispose fet also, I am not surprised as you were unacquainted with our industions, our design was take on the same footing with Respect to our Lands as we encredbefore the War on the Mohawk River, that is to have the free & indisputable light to them as we understood we should when we first look them and remain a free people as formerly we were after we had detained his Invoile have a map drawn of the Grand River, and such parts as might really be useless to ses In orde have Cut of, and have the remainder, Entailed, a Sufficiency for the whole of the haire Nations Should they be disposed to refine here when I have this mapfinished which is now drawing outs! will send it down to you with the places marked which see propose still to dispose of to convince you the more thoroughly four intentions and hope that you will think more favourably and allow that we are not going los far. Sam sony to have to add concerning these lands,
